- Studied law at the Universities of Geneva and Passau, at King's College London and at the University of California (Berkeley/Davis).
- He holds a doctorate in law, having written his thesis on "The Law of Economic and Monetary Union".
- From 1998 to 2000, Martin Selmayr worked first as Legal Counsel, then as external Legal Advisor for the European Central Bank in Frankfurt am Main.
- In 2000, he was sent as Visiting Official to the Legal Department of the International Monetary Fund in Washington D.C. where he worked on the arrangements for the representation of the euro area in international monetary institutions.
- In 2001, Martin Selmayr changed to the private sector where he started as Legal Advisor of the international media company Bertelsmann, with special focus on audiovisual, telecommunications and competition law issues.
- In 2003, Martin Selmayr became Head of the Brussels Office and Vice President Government & Legal Relations of Bertelsmann.
- Having succeeded in a competition for lawyers, Martin Selmayr joined the European Commission's Group of Spokesmen on 1 November 2004 as Spokesman for the Information Society and Media (Commissioner Viviane Reding).
- In his spare time, he lectures European Community Law at the Universities of Passau and Saarbrücken.
